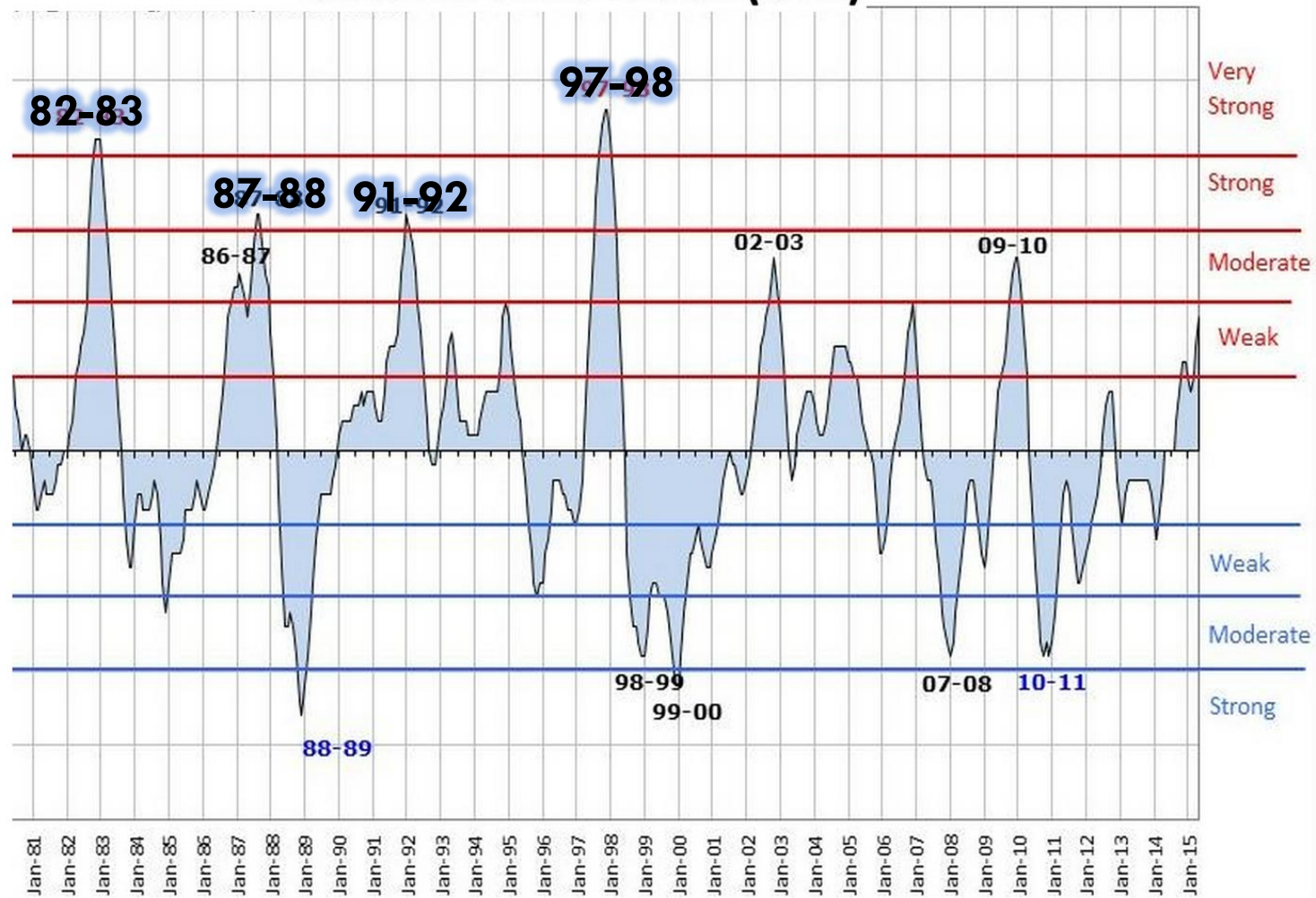




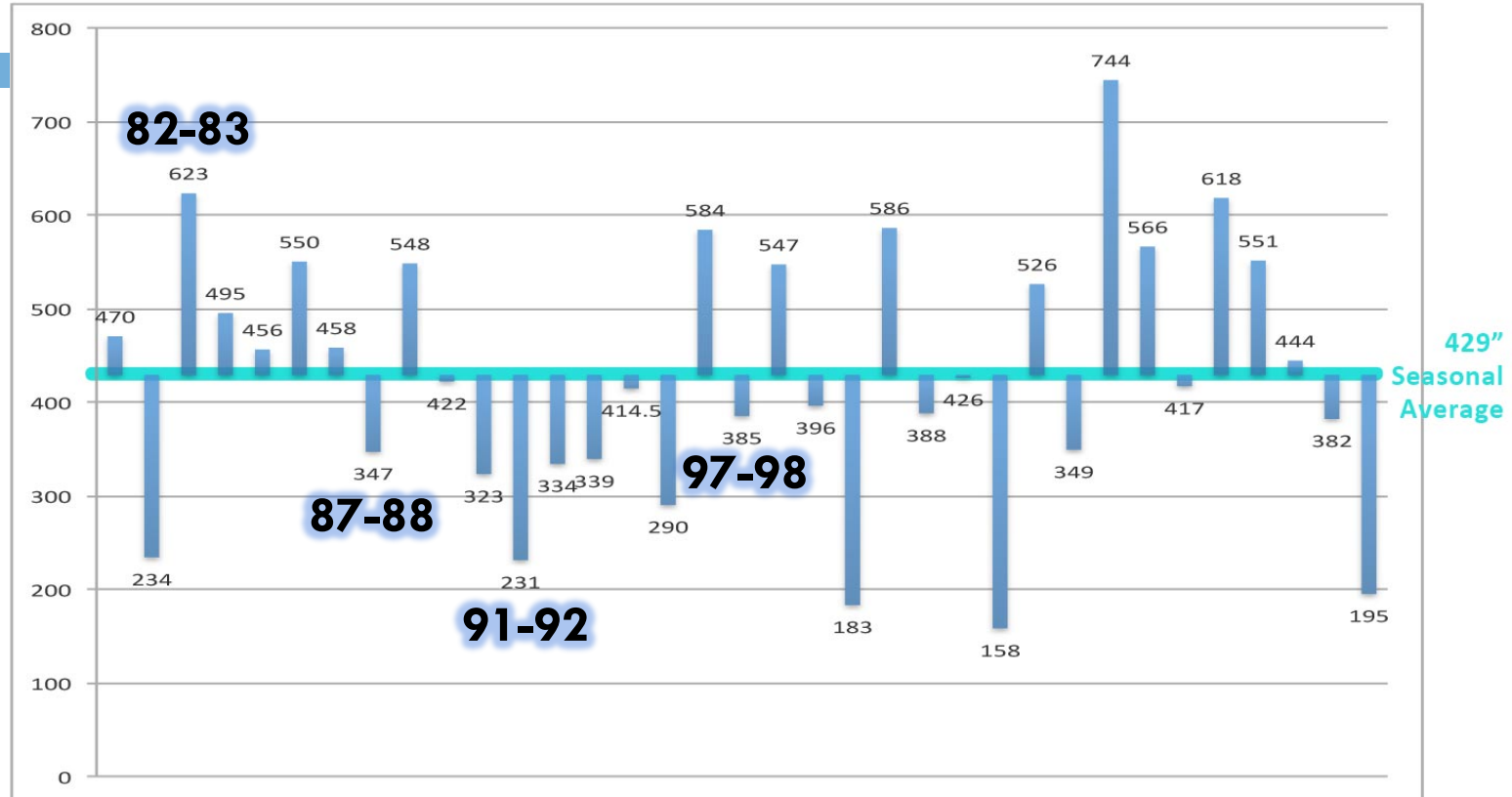




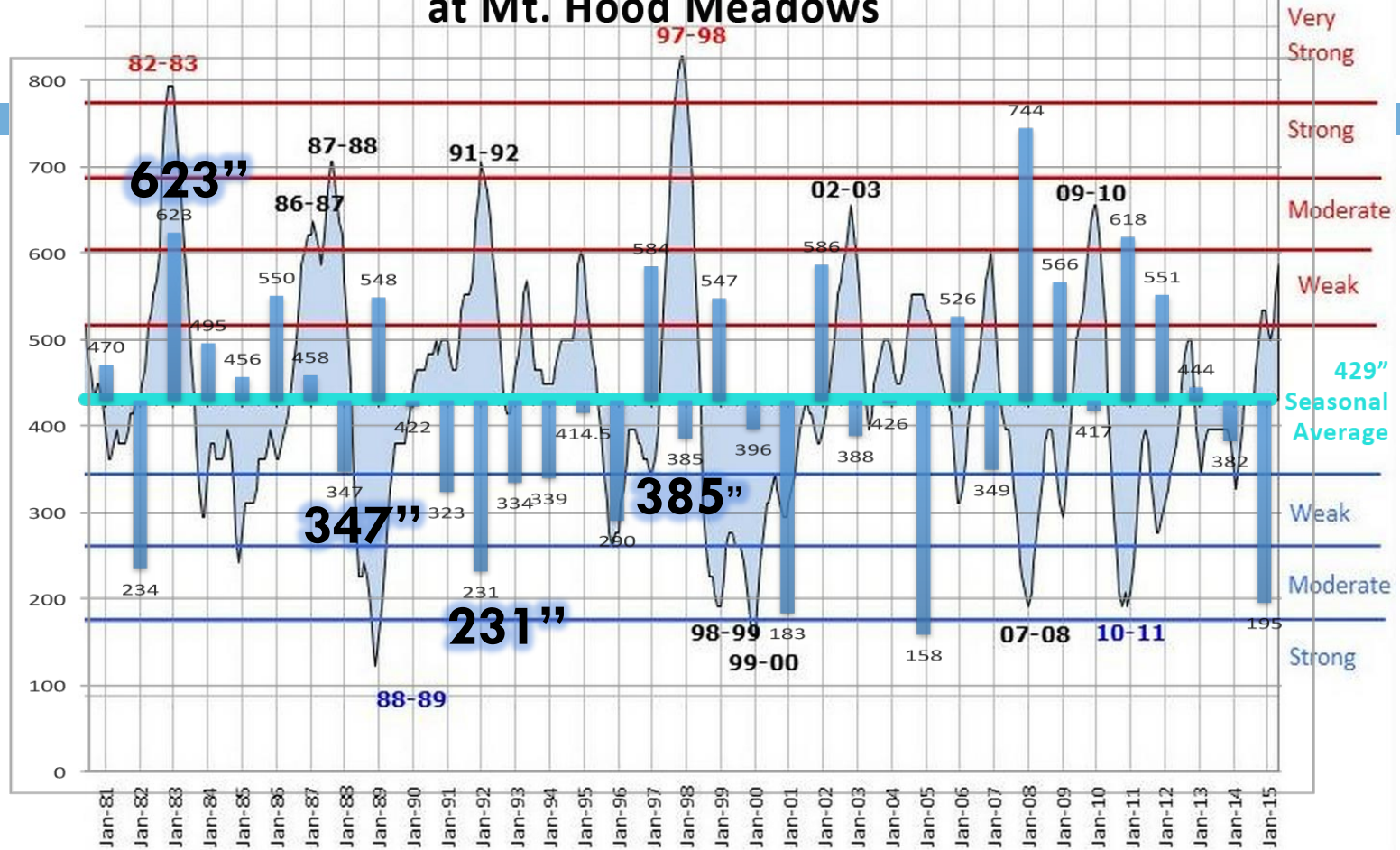
Oceanic Niño Index (ONI)



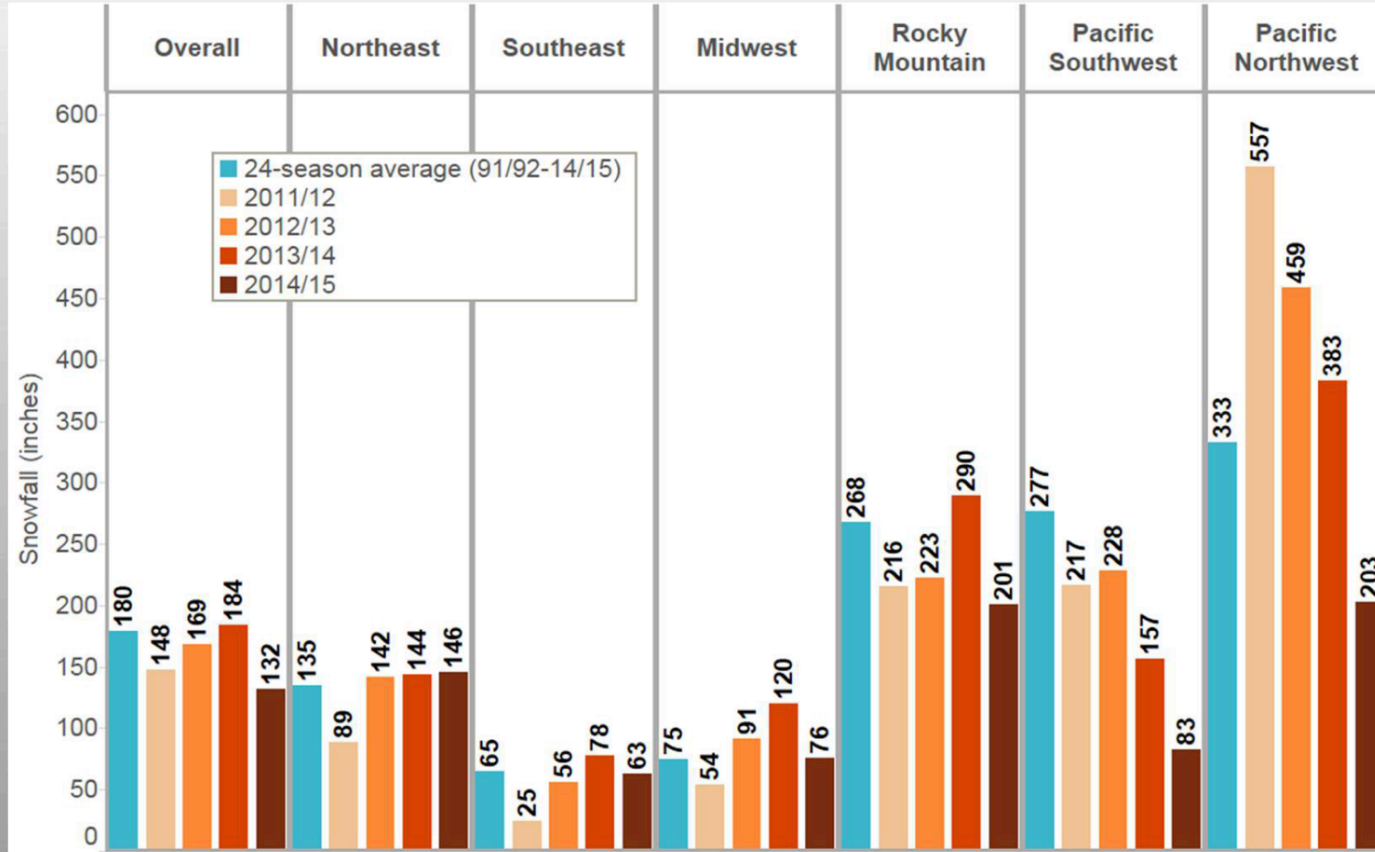
